Thank you for the opportunity to review this revised report, which our staff received this afternoon (Dega 2008): *An Archaeological Inventory Survey of Multiple Land Parcels within the Maui Research and Technology Park...*Scientific Consultant Services, Inc.

The report was first reviewed by SHPD staff on April 29 of 2008, resulting in a series of requested revisions (SHPD LOG NO: 2007.1016; DOC NO: 0804PC31) and again on June 11 of 2008 (SHPD DOC NO: 0806PC19) at which time it was accepted. The landowner subsequently informed you that he had made a mistake by failing to include a portion of a neighboring parcel, TMK (2) 2-2-024:012, in the original request for an inventory survey. Because the initial survey report had only recently been reviewed, we suggested that you complete the additional inventory level fieldwork and then amend the previously accepted report with the findings. An electronic (PDF) version of the amended inventory survey report was reviewed on September 26 (SHPD LOG NO: 2008.4508; DOC NO: 0810PC23) but was returned to you to complete two minor revisions. The most current version of the report was reviewed in PDF format to confirm completion of those revisions.

The survey area as described in the report consists of approximately 341 acres (137.9 hectare) in Waiohuli and Keokea *ahupua'a*, situated at TMK (2) 2-2-024: portions of 012, 014, 016, 054 and the entirety of 017. A 100% systematic survey was undertaken October through December 2006 with additional fieldwork in September of 2008, resulting in the identification of three new sites (SIHP #50-50-10-6239 and -6240 [WW II era modified outcrops], and -6241 [traditional/post-Contact boundary wall]), within TMK (2) 2-2-024:017 and two new sites (SIHP #50-50-10-6587 [WW II era L-Shape] and -6588 [three traditional period semi-circular rock mounds possibly used as markers]) within TMK (2) 2-2-024:054. While a portion of Waipuilani Gulch was also investigated through reconnaissance survey, two overhangs containing surface lithics observed within the gulch fall outside of the current project area and as such were not formally recorded. Subsurface testing conducted within sites 6587 and 6588 was negative for cultural deposits.

As stated in the initial review letter, we concur that Sites 50-50-10-6239 through -6241, -6587 and -6588 are significant under Hawai'i State Register of Historic Places Criterion D for their potential to yield information important to history or prehistory and that no further work is warranted with respect to the sites themselves because they are significant solely for information content and a reasonable and adequate

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amount of that information was collected during the survey. However, the recommendation that SIHP #50-50-10-6241 should be bordered by protective orange construction fencing prior to ground altering disturbance within TMK (2) 2-2-024:017 due to the known presence of unrecorded overhangs in Waipuilani Gulch is valid and we encourage SCS, Inc. to work with the landowner to ensure this is done prior to undertaking such work.

The report now contains the required information as specified in HAR §13-276-5 regarding documentation of inventory level field work completed in general and is acceptable.

Now that the inventory survey report has been accepted pursuant to HAR §13-276, please send one hardcopy of the current version, clearly marked **FINAL**, along with a copy of this review letter and a text-searchable PDF file on CD to the attention of "**SHPD Library**" at the Kapolei SHPD office.
