To the Hawaiian Land Use Commission;

As I am sure you have many letters to read and digest I will try to keep mine brief and address only a couple of points. I ask only that you do not mistake brevity for a lack of concern. On the contrary, I am deeply troubled by what is being proposed by this change in land use.

The good news is that the commission will not face legal challenges if it decides to maintain the Agricultural designation of this parcel. This is an easy one. Please support the people rather than the developers whose interests are purely financial.

I have been aware of this parcel of land and it's transfer of ownership through the most recent three owners. I have also been privy to inquiries for monetary assistance or appeals for joint ventures by some of these parties for the purpose of avoiding foreclosure and/or moving forward with this project. The current owners financial gamble is based on the pre-recession real estate market and the success of this gamble depends on the change in zoning proposed. In other words, this project is based more on the need of the owners to generate income and remain solvent rather than the true needs of the community and Kauai at large.

While there is no doubt Kauai needs more housing, this particular project does not address the level of affordability that is needed. While it does promise to increase the number of housing units, any such benefit is offset by the additional burden on our woefully inadequate transportation infrastructure, placing a negative balance on quality of life. While the project does offer some contribution of roadways to offset this problem, the infrastructure proposed in the plan is woefully inadequate and will ultimately cost the taxpayers money we don't have to build and maintain additional roads. The commission must place an emphasis on the prevention of problems for Kauai's citizens. In addition, the construction of over 750 housing units, in and of itself, will place undue stress on our landfill, a problem not often discussed when matters of construction are considered.

The need for additional housing does not outweigh the consequences of adding additional traffic to the Kapa'a corridor. This is a project that might be something to consider at a future time, when the necessary infrastructure is in place. It is not a project that should be approved for the benefit of a few investors who need to make good on their gamble.

I ask the commission to recognize that the Hokua Place project does not solve a problem as much as promise to create more problems for our island. The project is years ahead of its time, if at all. This is an opportunity to prevent a problem before it happens. Please do not approve the change in zoning on this parcel.
