Particularly when we read in the Traffic Analysis Report to the LUC on page 20; Table 2 and 3 that the analysis conducted includes a 58 room hotel. My question is why an FEIS with no plan on building a hotel on Olowalu point includes a hotel in the Traffic Analysis Report.
