

TESTIMONY OF NIGHT WALKERS

Aloha,

My name is Herman Kalani Naeole. I live at Kilauea Mauka right next to Kahoma Stream. I live up on the hillside, corner lot. We moved there in 1972, with my Dad and my Mom. My dad had a small farm next to the river, raising chickens, ducks, and guinea hens. At times we worked late down at the farm. One night we were working late and around midnight, it all happened.

All I heard was my Daddy telling me to turn off the 'Kukuihelepo' (the lantern) and which I did. And then my Daddy said 'Be quiet, don't say anything. After a while, he would say to me 'Do you hear anything?' and I say 'No. Then he said, 'Listen, listen good.' Seconds later, he said 'Do You hear it now?' And I would say 'Yes', sounds like water coming down the stream. Lots of water'. It sounds like boulders coming down the stream. Then my Dad said, 'No, that is not boulders. Those are footsteps.' And it got louder and louder as they got close, then real loud as they all started passing us. As the footsteps started fading, I looked up and saw silhouettes of people walking down the stream towards the ocean. And then I said to my Dad, 'Dad that is over a hundred people walking down', and my dad said in Hawaiian 'Kulikuli' which means to be quiet.

Latert as we were walking home, I asked him why did we turn off the lantern and why did they pass through here. And he said, 'These people are called night walkers They walk in the dark. That's why I told you to turn the lantern off. Then my Daddy said that there's got to be burial sights in this area and also there must have had a village here, so they come back to their village to come home to visit.

To the best of my knowledge, the night walkers do exist and I believe that this area should be left alone so they can come and go without any disturbance.

My name is Victoria Cheromcka and I have lived on Maui for 25 years. I bought my first home in 2002, a 1939 plantation house in old Wailuku town. Becoming a homeowner was truly a life changing experience, one that inspired me to become a Realtor. I earned my real estate license a year later and have helped many renters become homeowners in the last 10 years. My primary goal as a Realtor is to enable others to realize this dream for themselves.

Real estate values are so high on Maui and the challenges for first time buyers are so huge that I have found myself volunteering in many arenas over the years to fight for the cause of affordable housing. It is not easy to help Maui's work force become home owners and I view this advocacy as part of my job.

I have served on the Affordable Housing Committee of the Realtors Assoc. of Maui since 2005, was named chair person in 2007 and continue in that capacity through today. I have volunteered extensively with Housing for the Local Person aka HELP, FACE, Na Hale O Maui and serve on the Family Selection Committee for Habitat for Humanity.

Currently I am leading a Task Force comprised of Realtors and lenders, which is supported by the Maui County Dept of Housing and Human Concerns. We have banded together to get Maui condos back on the HUD approved lending list. Recertifying these condos will once again allow for condo purchases using safe, low down payment FHA and USDA loans.

Buying one's first home on Maui is not easy. We need many tools in our affordable housing tool belt here where our basic dirt is so expensive. Even with current lower market values and historically low interest rates, prices still are higher than most of America.

This year I am lucky to get entry level buyers into condos for under \$200,000 and that will soon be impossible. Finding houses under \$500,000 that are in decent condition and will qualify for a loan is becoming harder every month.

Yesterday I pulled the active listings in Lahaina, Napili, Kahana and Honokawai priced under \$500,000. There are only four on the entire west side and they are not pretty. I have attached the MLS printouts for your review. One is bank owned, one is a short sale, one has extensive fire damage, and several if not all have illegal additions. And most important, several if not all four will have difficulty qualifying for a loan. These four properties are what an entry level buyer has to choose from if they want a single family home in West Maui.

It is very important to realize the distinction between affordable housing and low income housing. Many people don't understand the difference and this adds to their resistance and their "not in my back yard mentality". Our work force, Maui's nurses, business owners, hospitality workers, teachers, civil servants, our professional work force as a whole need to be able to buy homes that are safe, lendable and affordable. Otherwise they will always be renters. Or they will leave Maui. That is very sad.

Finally, I would like to comment on the planned deed restrictions proposed for these homes relating to continued affordability. The 25 and 30 year restrictions used by Habitat for Humanity with shared equity increasing each year results in beautifully effective, long term affordability. The 5, 3 and 1 year restrictions for the rest of the project are too short and will repeat the mistakes made in the past of subsidizing one and only one owner with these short term restrictions.

I remember when people waited in line overnight to get into Ohia in Kehalani, Wailuku. I was there with a client. Many of these same people also lined up to sell as soon as the affordability restriction was waived 3 years later and those owners pocketed \$100,000 or \$200,000 in equity. A portion of this equity should have been better used to underwrite the home for another family. Shared equity restrictions that diminish over time are fair and reasonable. Subsidizing the first owner **only** is not effective affordable housing.

I encourage your support for this project together with a review of, and increase in, the affordability related deed restrictions.

Kahoma Residential Project will provide good neighbors thrilled and excited to have a home of their own. Imagine your son or daughter trying to find a home on the west side in this market.

Look at those listings I have attached to my testimony.

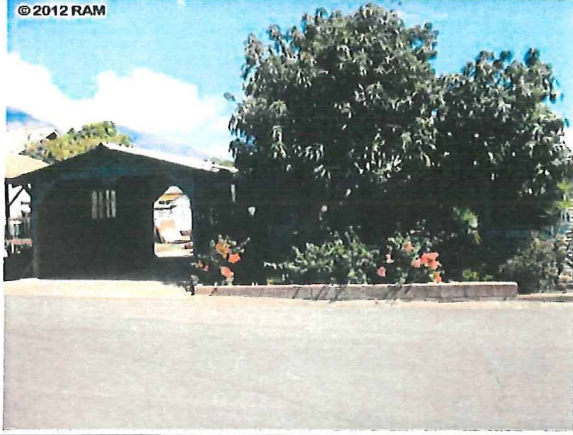

Aloha Chair and Members of the Commission. My name is David Goode and I am the Director of the County of Maui's Department of Public Works. I have been either the Deputy or the Director of the Department for 10 years. The Department administers the County's grading and erosion control, subdivision, and building ordinances.

On January, 9, 2012, the Mayor signed Ordinance Nos. 3902 and 3903, which gave the Department the authority to address water quality from storm water in the subdivision and building permit processes. The ordinances required rules to be adopted in order to effectuate the program. The ordinances were backed by both the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the National Ocean and Atmospheric Administration, and the State Department of Health, Clean Water Branch, who helped us draft the ordinances as part of a Statewide strategy to help protect near shore waters.

On November 9, 2012, after presentation to the Maui Planning Commission and the public through public hearings, the Department adopted new rules under Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), Chapter 15-111, entitled "Rules for the Design of Storm Water Treatment Best Management Practices". The rules became effective on November 25, 2012. As noted in the rules' purpose section, the rules will "... establish controls ... of storm water runoff pollution to the maximum extent practicable... long term water quality is generally impacted by the volume and frequency of discharged pollutants. Therefore, the water quality of the ocean ... would be impacted more by the runoff from smaller frequent storms ... (which) water quality measures should be designed to mitigate water quality impacts...."

These rules do exactly that: provide for best management practices to minimize storm water runoff pollution to receiving waters such as the ocean.

It should be noted and understood that these rules are different and in addition to our rules for the *quantity* of runoff from a new project. These new rules specifically address water *quality*. However, storm water systems built into various projects *may* be able to address *both* quantity and quality of storm water in the same system.

Preliminary calculations for the proposed storm water retention facility for the Kahoma project meet both the storm water quantity and quality rules. This is primarily because the proposed design of the retention basin incorporates an outlet at the top of the facility, not the bottom or middle of the facility as is commonly seen when designing for quantity only. It is important to note that until detailed construction plans and calculations are submitted, we cannot make a final determination, however, in any event, the final design will incorporate storm water quantity and quality measures before being approved by our Department.

Therefore, Chair and Members, in my opinion, near shore water quality will be protected to the maximum extent practicable through the implementation of storm water quality measures as called for in Ordinance Nos. 3902 and 3903 and the Rules for the Design of Storm Water Treatment Best Management Practices.
