Aloha Sean,

Jas. W. Glover, Ltd. has applied for a special permit to establish another quarry on agricultural land. You reviewed their archaeological studies (see Log #2014.01304, Doc# 1404SN19) and issued a 'no effect' letter with the condition that a qualified archaeological monitor be present during initial ground clearing/grubbing due to thick vegetation on the property. They provided an archaeological monitoring plan for their property in June 2014.

At the Land Use Commission hearing in late 2014, the Dept of the Army provided an AIS for their adjacent property, which identified 2 historic sites within 300 feet of Glover's property. SIHP# 50-10-35-30038 is an intact trail segment of the historic Puna Trail alignment and SIHP# 50-10-35-21658 is complex of five stacked stone ahu associated with the Puna Trail. The Dept of Army requested that Glover take adequate measures (i.e. buffer zones) to protect these sites; however given that the sites are 300 feet away from Glover's property Planning does not believe the quarry activities will negatively impact these historic sites. The Dept of Army AIS is 36 megabytes so if you need a copy I can provide it by CD. Let me know.


The LUC also requested that Glover provide info about how the project will affect the preservation and protection of customary and traditional native practices.

The Planning Department has determined that the Ka Pa'akai Discussion prepared by ASM Affiliates adequately identifies the location and extent of use of valued cultural, historical and natural resources on the property and surrounding area as well as the extent to which the resources will be affected by the proposed quarry project and action needed to protect native Hawaiian rights.

Please let me know whether SHPD concurs with the Planning Department's conclusions. I would appreciate a response by **Thursday, May 26th** so that we can have SHPD's determination prior to the Planning Commission hearing scheduled for June 2nd.
