1. The Photoelectric Effect
The photoelectric effect is the emission of electrons from a metal surface when light of a certain frequency is incident on it. The energy of the incident light is transferred to the electrons, causing them to be ejected from the metal.


2. Compton Scattering
Compton scattering is the scattering of a photon by a free electron, resulting in a decrease in the photon's energy and an increase in its wavelength. This phenomenon is a direct consequence of the particle nature of light.

3. The Bohr Model of the Atom
The Bohr model of the atom is a semi-classical model of an atom in which electrons orbit the nucleus in discrete energy levels. It was proposed by Niels Bohr in 1913 and is a key component of quantum mechanics.

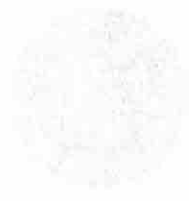

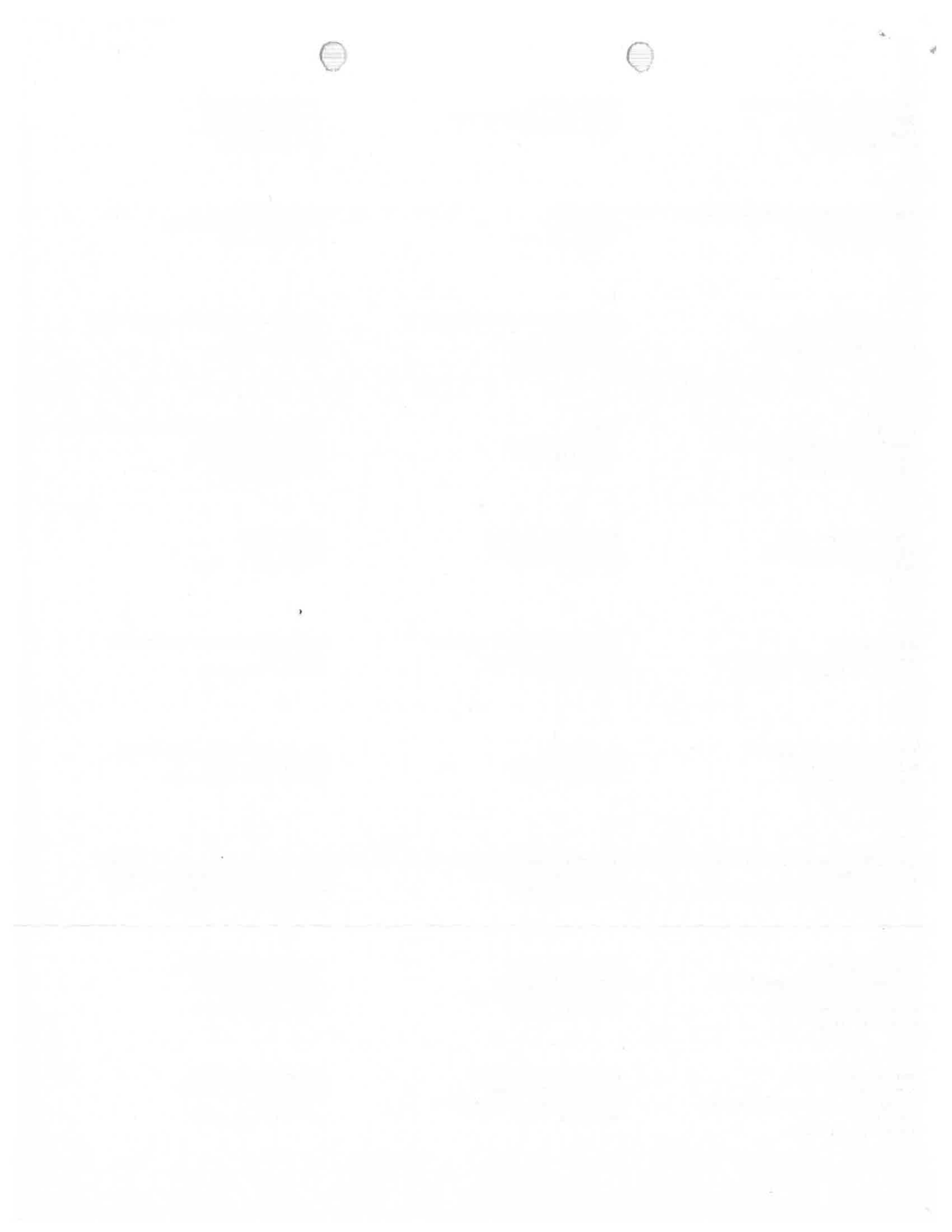
