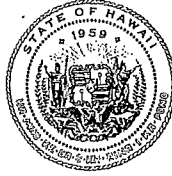

On November 13, 2017, Hawaiian Memorial Life Plan, Ltd. filed a Petition to the State Land Use Commission for a Land Use District Boundary Amendment to reclassify approximately 53.45 acres of land from the State Conservation District to the Urban District for the Hawaiian Memorial Park Cemetery Expansion project. This property is identified as Tax Map Key (1) 4-5-033: por. 001 located in the Kāne'ōhe ahupua'a on the Island of O'ahu

This project is subject to §6E-42, HRS, as it involves a land use change that may affect historic properties in the project area. We are submitting an archaeological inventory survey report entitled "Draft Archaeological Inventory Survey Report for Hawaiian Memorial Park, Kāne'ōhe Ahupua'a, Ko'olaupoko District, O'ahu TMK: [1] 4-5-033:001" for your review under §6E-42, HRS.

The Draft AIS report was written in accordance with §6E-42, HRS and §13-284, HAR (Rules Governing Procedures for Historic Preservation Review for 6E-42 Projects). The report was prepared in accordance with HAR §13-276 (Rules Governing Standards for Archaeological Inventory Surveys and Reports) and is intended for review and acceptance by SHPD.

An archaeological reconnaissance survey (Szabian et al. 1989) and AIS (McCurdy and Hammatt 2009) were previously conducted on the subject property, resulting in the documentation of 10 historic properties. The current AIS investigation was conducted by Honua Consulting between September 21, 2017 and June 22, 2018. The 10 previously documented sites were re-assessed during the current AIS and 14 new sites (Honua 1-14) were identified and documented. Excavation was conducted only at one site, Honua 14, a historic guava charcoal kiln. Recommended mitigation measures include a Data Recovery Program, Preservation Plan, and Archaeological Monitoring Program.

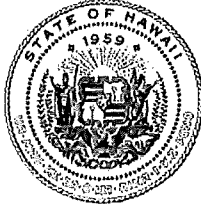
