Kumu Leinā'ala Fruean is a Hawaiian descendant of Hawai'i Island; she carries a priestly lineage to High Priest Hewahewa (prophet who prophesied the coming of the gospel to the Hawaiian Islands) and a legacy of the great warrior Kekūhaupi'o of Hawai'i.

Born and raised in Kona, Hawai'i, Leinā'ala Fruean is the daughter of Kahu Bobby Laioha & Thelma Macomber they are the pastors of Kahikolu Church in Kealahou. The historical church was built around 1833 and today they are caretakers of the First Hawaiian Missionary named Henry 'Ōpūkaha'ia.

In 1983 Leinā'ala experienced her first YWAM C.D.T.S. outreach to New Zealand, Australia, Fiji and Samoa with her parents. By 1989 Leina'ala did her DTS at the age of 16 and joined the ministry of Island Breeze Hawai'i. Not long after Leinā'ala moved to New Zealand In 1990 to assist in pioneering Island Breeze New Zealand for 10 years. Leina'ala married her husband Siona Fruean and they both traveled to Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Brazil, Canada, Japan, Tahiti, Fiji, Nasaau, China, Hong Kong, and 43 states in America sharing the gospel. They have three amazing children.

Kumu Leinā'ala Fruean is the Director of Hāleo Hawai'i Language community program and the Director of Sales for Island Breeze Productions Inc. She also lectures on the Hawaiian host cultural values in the business sectors in Hawaii and the Universities in Kona. Leinā'ala is a trustee for the Hualālai Village and cultural advisors for various groups and councils.

Today, she continues to serve as a cultural advisor to families, businesses, churches, and education sectors in the Hawaiian Islands. Leina'ala yearn to see the Hawaiian people, Pacific Islanders and indigenous people groups restored and reconciled to God with Kingdom mandates on earth that will equip them to take their office as apostles, leaders and influencer for all sphere of society on earth.
