On behalf of Piilani Promenade North LLC and Piilani Promenade South LLC (collectively, "Piilani"), we submit this letter report in anticipation of the State Land Use Commission meeting scheduled for September 26, 2019. We understand that the Commission would like to receive a report on the status of the settlement discussions in this matter.
