The Wastewater Management Division has **not** been provided drawings on how this project would

connect to the County's sewer system. The County is unaware of how much flow will be produced by

Hokua Place and whether the existing sewer system has enough capacity to accommodate this flow.

The current Wastewater Management Division Chief, Jason Kagimoto, does not have the information to be able to

determine whether Hokua Place can be serviced.

Sea Level Rise affecting the Waste Water Plant (WWP)?

The Wailua WWTP (waste water treatment plant) will need to address the issue of sea level rise and this may involve relocation.

At the moment though here are no current plans to do so.

My take on this is that Hokua Place will not be able to fulfill requirements for waste water disposal before the final public hearing

January 6-7, and the WWT admits that sea level therefore approval of the project should be denied By LUC
