Both the County and the State submitted that they did not see the necessity to amend the condition as requested by the petitioner. They were primarily concerned with the elimination of the odor and mosquito problems and whether the present proposal will accomplish this.

Ms. Chock introduced a letter from the Department of Health addressing their concerns over the same problems, and asked that the letter be admitted as DPED's exhibit 1. It was subsequently admitted into the record.

Chairman Yuen summed up the follow-up procedures for the request by petitioner as follows:

- 1. An analysis by the petitioner of the effect of the proposal on storm water.
- 2. An analysis by the petitioner as to the necessity of amending the condition.
- 3. County's analysis of the proposal.

All the parties were advised that the Commission will ultimately have to rule on whether the conditions have been satisfied, and the sooner the foregoing analyses are filed, the sooner the Commission will be able to rule on this.
