## A83-554 - FARMS OF KAPUA (Hawaii)

Pursuant to a notice published in the Honolulu Advertiser and Hawaii Tribune Herald on September 4, 1987 and notices sent to all parties, a reopened hearing was called by the Land Use Commission in the matter of the petition by Farms of Kapua to receive additional evidence from the parties pursuant to an Order from the Third Circuit Court remanding this matter to the Land Use Commission to provide substantially greater archaeological reconnaissance survey of the "mauka" areas; to provide more evidence regarding the implementation of the 1983 Hawaii Senate Resolution No. 65 "Requesting Further Action on the Designation of a State Natural Recreational and Historic Park at Kapua, Honomalino, Okoe, Kaulanamauna, and Manuka Districts in South Kona and Ka'u, Island of Hawaii,"; and to provide evidence on the impact that the requested classification change will have on the implementation of S.R.
