#### ACTION

# A83-550 - A. R. NYLEN AND RAYMOND H. NYLEN

In the matter of the petition by A. R. Nylen and Raymond H. Nylen to amend the boundary from the Conservation District into the Urban District at Kahaluu, Koolaupoko, Oahu, a hearing had been conducted by Hearing Officer Matsubara on October 11, 1984.

Based on his findings adduced at the hearing, it was Mr. Matsubara's proposed conclusion of law that reclassification of the subject property below the 300-foot elevation contour line, consisting of approximately 7.9 acres at Kahaluu, Oahu, from the Conservation District into the Urban District was reasonable and non-violative of Section 205-2 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

Mr. Yokoyama spoke of the city's concerns with possible erosion problems, waste disposal system, availability of water, etc. However, upon a review of the Hearing Officer's report, it was the city's feeling that reclassification of a portion of the property, below the 300' elevation, as recommended by Mr. Matsubara would be acceptable.

It was moved by Commissioner Choy to approve the Hearing Officer's recommendation to reclassify a portion of the property up to the 300' level from the Conservation District into the Urban District at Kahaluu, Oahu, Docket A83-550. It was seconded by Commissioner Rubin and the Commissioners were polled as follows:

The motion was carried.

#### A84-579 - PECA-IBEW TRAINING FUND

In the matter of the petition by PECA-IBEW Training Fund to amend the boundary from the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Pupukea, Loa, Oahu, a hearing had been conducted by Hearing Officer Matsubara on December 14, 1984.

Commissioner Tamaye moved that the property which is the subject of this petition, Docket A84-573, Oceanic Properties, Inc., consisting of approximately 74 acres of land situated at Ainakea, Hawaii, be reclassified from the Agricultural District into the Urban District subject to the following conditions:

"Petitioner shall provide housing opportunities for low and moderate income Hawaii residents in any one or combination of the following manner, prior to assigning or transferring its interest in the subject property: First, to offer for sale on a preferential basis on its own, or in cooperation with either or both the Hawaiian Housing Authority or the County of Hawaii, to be developed on a 5.3 acre portion of the subject property to residents of the State of Hawaii of low and moderate family income as determined by the Hawaii Housing Authority or County of Hawaii from time to time. Preferential lots shall be offered for sale at prices not exceeding prices that enable such buyers to qualify for and obtain state assisted financing intended to encourage home ownership by low and moderate income families, or to dedicate to the development of

an elderly multifamily housing a 5.3 acre portion of the subject property. Petitioner shall continue to afford private doctors an opportunity to lease the existing Kohala Health Center for community medical services. These conditions may be fully or partially released by the Commission as to all or any portion of the subject property upon timely motion and provision of adequate assurance of satisfaction of these conditions by the petitioner."

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Choy and the Commissioners were polled as follows:

The motion was passed.
