ACTION

Vice Chairman Tacbian called the meeting to order.

A84-576 - HALEAKALA GREENS CORP.

In the matter of the petition by Haleakala Greens Corp. to reclassify approximately 229.3 acres of land from the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Kula, Makawao, Maui for a golf course, a hearing had been conducted by the Land Use Commission on January 29, 1985.

It was determined by Vice Chairman Tacbian that all of the Commissioners present today were eligible to participate in the action on the various petitions.

Commissioner Suzuki moved to reclassify the property which is the subject of the petition consisting of approximately 229.3 acres of land in Kihei, Maui, for the development of a golf course and related facilities from the State Land Use Agricultural to the Urban District, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Prior to any construction activity, an archaeological reconnaissance survey of the subject property shall be conducted by a qualified archaeologist. Copies of the completed survey report shall be submitted to the Historic Site Office of the State Department of Land and Natural Resources for their review and comment prior to the start of construction.
- 2. The petitioner shall make roadway and traffic improvements to the Lipoa Street/Piilani Highway intersection at the time it is deemed necessary due to increased traffic flow because of the golf course and R&T Park as determined in consultation with the State Department of Transportation. The petitioner shall share equally in the expense of such improvements with the developer of the R&T project.
- 3. The applicant develop a secondary irrigation water sourge which can be utilized for turf and landscape irrigation in the event the primary water system exceeds established safety levels.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Whittemore.

Commissioner Cuskaden suggested, subject to the approval of the movant of the motion, that the following clause be added to the motion: "These conditions may be amended or released at any time by the Commission, upon timely motion and provision of adequate assurance of satisfaction by petitioner."

Both the movant and seconder of the motion agreed with the suggested addition.

The motion to approve the petition was approved.

A84-587 - MAUI ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BOARD, INC.

In the matter of the petition by Maui Economic Development Board, Inc. to reclassify approximately 300 acres of land from the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Kihei, Maui, a hearing had been conducted by the Land Use Commission on January 30, 1985.

It was moved by Commissioner Suzuki to approve the reclassification of 150 acres of the southern portion of the property which is the first phase of the petitioner's proposed development, consisting of approximately 300 acres of land at Kihei, Maui, for the development of a research and technology park and related facilities, from the Agricultural District into the Urban District; and to approve on an incremental basis, upon substantial completion of the first phase within five years of the date of Commission's Order, and recommend the reclassification of the remaining 150 acres of the property to the Urban District, subject to the following conditions:

Prior to any construction activities, an archaeological reconnaissance survey of the subject property shall be conducted by a qualified archaeologist. Copies of the completed survey report shall be submitted to the Historic Sites Office of the State Department of Land & Natural Resources for their review and comments before start of construction.

- 2. The petitioner shall make roadway and traffic improvements to the Lipoa/Piilani Highway intersection at the time it is deemed necessary due to the increased traffic flow because of the R&T park and golf course as determined in consultation with the State Department of Transportation, withouthed petitioner sharing equally in expense of such improvements with the developer of the golf course.
- 3. The petitioner shall develop and use the property for industrial uses, including research, technology development and manufacturing and related uses.
- 4. The applicant develop a secondary irrigation water source which can be utilized for turf and landscape irrigation.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cuskaden.

Commissioner Cuskaden suggested that the motion be amended, subject to Commissioner Suzuki's concurrence, by substituting the following condition for condition No. 3 above:

"Petitioner shall develop subject property as an industrial park for high technology usage. High technology means emerging industries which are technology-intensive, including but not limited to electronics and biotechnology."
