Edward Kushi, Jr. amended his petition to address only the first issue that Dwellings rather than Farm Dwellings that are required on State Agricultural District Land with soils classification of "E" lands in accordance with Section 205-4.5. There were no objections by the parties.

Commission Tacbian moved that the requirement under Section 205-4.5, H.R.S. which requires that "Dwellings" be "Farm Dwellings" is not mandatorily applicable to C, D, E, and U agricultural lands. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kajioka and unanimously carried by the following voice votes:

Commissioner Hoe moved to go into an executive session to discuss legal matters with our Special Deputy Attorney General, Benjamin Matsubara, Esq. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kajioka.
