# A79-462 - KOMOHANA INVESTORS

Pursuant to a notice published in the Honolulu Advertiser and the Hawaii Tribune Herald on November 30, 1979, and notices sent to all parties, a hearing was called by the Land Use Commission in the matter of the petition by Komohana Investors to amend the land use district boundaries for approximately 212 acres of land presently in the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Punahoa 1st and Ponahawai, South Hilo, Hawaii, Docket A79-462.

The Executive Officer presented a chronological account of the untimely request for intervention which had been filed by Ms. Elizabeth Stone.

Objections to the petition for intervention were voiced by Mr. Cook and Mr. Kanuha. Miss Chock did not take any position.

It was moved by Vice Chairman Nakagawa that the petition to intervene by Ms. Stone be denied, which was seconded by Commissioner Whitesell and unanimously carried.

Vice Chairman Nakagawa moved to permit Ms. Stone to appear as a public witness, which was seconded by Commissioner Yuen and unanimously approved.

Chairman Duke directed Mr. Cook to draft the Decision and Order relative to the denial of Ms. Stone's intervention petition.

### Public Witness

One untimely request to appear as a witness, filed by Jennifer Perry, President of the Hilo-Puna Young Farmers, was noted. Ms. Leslie Hill advised that she will be representing the Hilo-Puna Young Farmers in Ms. Perry's absence. The reasons for the untimely application were explained by Ms. Hill.

Commissioner Whitesell moved to waive the time requirement and allow the Hilo-Puna Young Farmers to testify. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Yuen and unanimously carried.
