### HEARING

#### A76-418 - MOANA CORPORATION

Pursuant to a notice published in the Garden Island and the Honolulu Advertiser on December 8, 1976, and notices sent to all parties, a hearing was called by the Land Use Commission in the matter of the petition by Moana Corporation to amend the land use district boundar ies for approximately 457 acres presently in the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Poipu, Koloa, Kauai, for residential, commercial, outdoor theater, cultural center, and recreational uses; Docket No. A76-418.

The property under petition was identified and located on the various maps by the Executive Officer.

# Petition for Intervention by Ohana 'O Maha'Ulepu

Upon Chairman Tangen's recommendation, Commissioner Duke moved to admit Ohana'O Maha'Ulepu as a party to the proceedings, on the condition that Miss Tico will represent them and conduct the examinations, and service also to be on Miss Tico. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Whitesell and the Commissioners were polled as follows:

# Request for Continuance of the Hearing

Miss Tico requested a continuance of the hearing for Ohana'O Maha'Ulepu's portion of the presentation since they were granted leave to intervene at such a late date.

Both the County and the State concurred with Mr. Hong's objections to the request on the basis that since Miss Tico will also be counsel to Ohana'O Maha'Ulepu, no prejudice had been shown.

Commissioner Duke moved to deny Miss Tico's request for continuance, seconded by Commissioner Carras, and the motion was carried with the following votes:

### Request for Issuance of Subpoenas

Miss Tico requested a continuance of the hearing for two weeks in order to require the attendance of the subpoenaed witnesses.

Chairman Tangen recommended that both the request for issuance of subpoena and request for continuance of hearing by Miss Tico be taken under advisement for the present.
