CONTINUED HEARING

A76-423 - WINDWARD PARTNERS

The continuation of the hearing on Docket A76-423 was called to order by Chairman Tangen.

Mr. Hawkins, representing the petitioner, moved to disqualify Commissioner Machado from the proceedings on the grounds that her views were biased against the petitioner. Commissioner Machado maintained that she held no prejudicial views against any of the intervenors or the petitioner. Commissioner Duke supported Commissioner Machado's position and expressed confidence in her ability to maintain an impartial posture. He therefore moved to deny Mr. Hawkins' motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Whitesell and unanimously carried.

At this point, Mr. Hare again requested permission to present a 30-minute slide/(at the conclusion of his case), portraying an overview of the petitioner's background, discussing the impact of the development on the Waiahole/Waikane community and analysis of alternatives.

Upon examination of the specific nature and purpose of the slides, Mr. Marsh counselled the Commission as follows:

- 1. The slide show may possibly contain some relevant information such as the alternatives to the proposed development. However, there were some things which were clearly irrelevant, e.g., the eviction proceedings which would constitute a significant portion of the slide show.
- 2. The slide show includes, to a great degree, testimony and evidence with respect to Waiahole Valley, which lands are not the subject of the present petition.
- 3. Moreover, there has been no indication that the information contained in the slides would not be duplicative of the testimony already presented before the Commission.
- 4. Therefore, on the basis of Mr. Hare's offer of proof, it would not be improper for the Commission to exclude the slide show as being irrelevant and duplicative.

Commissioner Yanai moved to deny the request for the slide presentation, which was seconded by Commissioner Machado, and unanimously carried.

CLOSING STATEMENTS

Mr. Michael Hare submitted that the petitioner has not complied with the Interim Statewide Land Use Guidance Policy; expressed concern over the inadequacy of public services and facilities and the adverse effect on agriculture, the environment, Kaneohe Bay and most of all to the people of Waiahole-Waikane Valleys.

Mr. Hawkins expressed his confidence in the Commission's capability to render a fair and just decision based on all of the evidence presented during the hearing.

Chairman Tangen expressed his appreciation to the people present for their participation in the proceedings and expressed his views that the Commission will be better equipped to make a proper decision because of the amount of information that had been made available to them.

He again thanked Reverend Martin for his cordial hospitality.

The hearing on Docket A75-423 was closed and the Chairman advised the petitioner of the deadlines for the filing of the proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, service to all parties, etc.
