HEARING

A76-421 - WEST BEACH DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Pursuant to a notice published in the Honolulu Star Bulletin on March 13, 1977, and notices sent to all parties, a hearing was called by the Land Use Commission in the matter of the petition by West Beach Development Corporation to amend the land use district boundaries for approximately 830 acres presently in the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Honouliuli, Ewa, Oahu, for hotel, marina, golf course, residential and commercial uses; Docket No. A76-421.

Motion for a Change in Time and Place of Hearing

In the matter of the motion by the Ewa Beach Aliis, intervenor, to a change in time and place of hearing, Chairman Tangen recommended that the Commission recess at 5:00 p.m. today and reconvene at 7:00 p.m. to accommodate those witnesses who may otherwise be unable to testify.

Commissioner Duke so moved, which was seconded by Vice Chairman Sakahashi.

Miss Karen Radius, representing the Ewa Beach Aliis, submitted that the motion was filed in order to take the hearing to a location halfway between Ewa Beach and the Waianae Coast for the convenience of the witnesses who reside in these areas.

Commissioner Duke noted that there was adequate bus service between the Waianae Coast and Waipahu.

The Commissioners were polled and the motion was carried unanimously.
