Chairman Tangen observed that the slides, although interesting and well done, did not address itself totally to the petition. Mr. Kupchak offered to delete all matters which did not pertain to Kawainui, but requested retention of the slides dealing with the scenic aspects of Kawainui in the record. Chairman Tangen ruled that the Commission consider only those slides dealing with

the subject parcel.
