# Closing Arguments

Counselors for the petitioner, the County and the State all waived their closing arguments.

Chairman Duke instructed all parties to file proposed findings, conclusions of law within 30 days after the completion of the transcript, and that 15 days will be allowed for the parties to respond to the proposals.

The meeting was in recess for 5 minutes.

#### ACTION

SP79-340 - THE LIHUE PLANTATION CO.

SPECIAL PERMIT TO ALLOW THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SANDMINING OPERATION AT KEALIA, KAUAI

It was noted by Chairman Duke that action on the subject Special Permit had been deferred from yesterday.

Staff planner pointed out the location of the subject property on the maps and oriented its location with various surrounding landmarks. A resume of the request was also presented.

Vice Chairman Nakagawa raised several questions regarding the relocation of the homes presently occupied by the plantation employees and whether there were any specific plans to accomplish this. Staff reported that the record from the County did not contain this information.

Vice Chairman Nakagawa moved to defer action on SP79-340 until such time as staff can contact the Kauai County Planning Commission for additional information regarding the relocation of the homes.

With respect to the time period for action on this Special Permit, the Executive Officer advised that since the total record from the County had been transmitted on different dates, the Commission would still be within the statutory requirements for action on Special Permits.

Vice Chairman Nakagawa amended his motion to "remand the Special Permit back to the County Planning Commission requesting additional information regarding the relocation program" rather than to defer action. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Whitesell and unanimously carried.

#### ADOPTION OF MINUTES

The minutes of November 16, 1978 and December 5, 1978 were approved as circulated.
