ACTION

Upon motion by Vice Chairman Choy, seconded by Commissioner Tacbian, the agenda was rearranged to consider SP80-349, Princeville at Hanalei, as the first item.

SP80-349 - PRINCEVILLE AT HANALEI (Amendment)

Request to amend approved boundaries and allow a time extension for development of a golf course at Princeville, Hanalei, Kauai

Staff planner pointed out the area under petition on the USGS and tax maps, and gave a resume of the special permit being requested.

Questions were raised regarding the fact that hearings were not conducted at the County level for the extension request or the amendment to the approved boundaries, and whether the petitioner would be bound by the one-year waiting period to reapply, should the Commission deny either request.

It was moved by Commissioner Tacbian, seconded by Commissioner Rubin to go into executive session to receive counsel.

The Commission was in executive session from 9:15 a.m. to 9:25 a.m.

Chairman Yuen announced that the Commission received counsel from the Deputy Attorney General regarding the options available to the Commission.

Commissioner Tacbian moved that the special permit request be denied, which was seconded by Commissioner Tamaye. In support of his motion, Commissioner Tacbian elaborated that the procedures for a special permit amendment were not followed by the County, i.e. a public hearing was not conducted.

The Chair indicated for the record that Commissioner Cuskaden had declared a conflict of interest in this matter and will not participate in the deliberations.

The motion to deny the special permit request was unanimously carried.

A81-524 - CAMBRIDGE PACIFIC, INC.

In the matter of the petition by Cambridge Pacific, Inc. to reclassify approximately 65 acres of land from the Urban to the Conservation District, and 65 acres from the Conservation District into the Urban District at Kaupulehu, North Kona, Hawaii, a hearing was conducted by the Land Use Commission on February 25 and 26, 1982. Both Commissioners Rubin and Whittemore were deemed eligible to participate in this action proceedings since they had reviewed the petition and transcripts of the hearings.

It was moved by Commissioner Tamaye to approve Docket A81-524 to reclassify approximately 65 acres from the Urban District into the Conservation District, and approximately 65 acres from the Conservation District into the Urban District, subject to the following conditions: That the petitioner shall provide housing opportunities for employees of the Kona Village Hotel and for the resort to be constructed on the subject property in any one or combination of the following manner prior to its signing or transferring its interest in the subject property:

- 1. To construct, either on or off the subject property (on land to be acquired by the petitioner), a number of residential units for sale or rental to employees of the Kona Village Hotel and/or the resort to be constructed on the subject property at the prices or rentals affordable by said employees, and or a size standard equivalent to Federal Housing Administration Minimum Property Standards, equal to ten percent (10%) of the number of condominium apartments or hotel rooms to be constructed on the subject property; or
- 2. To pay to the Hawaii Housing Authority or County of Hawaii, for use in a housing assistance fund or for the benefit of employees of the Kona Village Hotel and/or the resort to be constructed on the subject property or low and moderate income residents of the State of Hawaii, a sum determined by the Hawaii Housing Authority or County of Hawaii to be equal to the cost of acquiring land for, developing and constructing a number of residential units equal to ten percent (10%) of the number of condominium apartments or hotel rooms to be constructed on the subject property; and

Petitioner shall provide access from Queen Kaahumanu Highway to the shoreline, for public recreational purposes along the entire length of shoreline owned, leased or controlled by petitioner and its successors, and assigns, the location and form of said easements to be approved and accepted by the County of Hawaii.

These conditions may be fully or partially released by the Commission as to all or any portion of the subject property upon timely motion and provision of adequate assurance of satisfaction of these conditions by the petitioner.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tacbian.

Commissioner Cuskaden questioned representations made by the petitioner regarding the need and justification for the proposed development, and also expressed concern over the spot-zoning which will result from the reclassification of lands under petition.

The motion to approve Docket A81-524 was carried.

Chairman Yuen led the Commission in the adoption of the true findings of fact, conclusions of law and directed the Deputy Attorney General to prepare the Commission's Decision and Order relative to this petition.

HEARING

A82-528 - ALEXANDER & BALDWIN, INC.

Chairman Yuen declared a conflict of interest and disqualified himself from participating in the proceedings on this petition, and turned the meeting over to Vice Chairman Choy.

Pursuant to a notice published in the Maui News and the Honolulu Advertiser on April 30, 1982 and notices sent to all parties, a hearing was called by the Land Use Commission in the matter of the request by Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. to reclassify approximately 29.201 acres of land currently in the Agricultural District into the Urban District at Pulehunui, Kihei, Maui for a shopping center and office complex, Docket A82-528.
