A83-554 - FARMS OF KAPUA

Pursuant to a notice published in the Hawaii Tribune Herald and the Honolulu Advertiser on September 20, 1983 and notices sent to all parties, a hearing was called by the Land Use Commission in the matter of the petition by Farms of Kapua, A83-554, to reclassify approximately 6,102 acres of land currently in the Conservation District into the Agricultural District at Kapua, South Kona, Hawaii, for agricultural use.

Intervention Request

Chairman Yuen announced that the Commission was in receipt of three timely requests to intervene in the proceedings as follows:

- 2. Office of Hawaiian Affairs
- 3. Pa'apono of Milolii, Inc.

It was noted for the record that Ms. Stone was not present and therefore her request for intervention was denied.

It was also announced that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs had withdrawn its intervention request on October 21, 1983.

It was moved by Commissioner Rubin, seconded by Commissioner Whittemore, to allow Pa'apono of Milolii, Inc. to intervene in the matter of Docket A83-554, Farms of Kapua, as an interested party. The motion was carried by voice vote.

Intervenor's Motion to Continue Hearing

Following a brief statement by Miss Lenell in support of the motion, Chairman Yuen declared that Pa'apono's motion to continue the hearing was denied.

Intervenor's Motion to Conduct On-site Visit

The Chairman stated that an on-site visit to the subject lands may be possible in the event the Commission continues the hearing for a third day, some time in the future.

Complaint filed in Circuit Court regarding Negative Declaration

For the Commission's information, Miss Lenell submitted that Pa'apono had filed a complaint in the Circuit Court to appeal the Commission's negative declaration of the impact on the environment.
