ACTION

A78-436 - FLORO & TRINIDAD VILLABRILLE

In the matter of the boundary amendment petition by Floro & Trinidad Villabrille, Docket A78-436, on which a hearing was held on May 26, 1978 by the Hearing Officer, a resume of his prepared report to the Commission was presented by Hearing Officer Benjamin Matsubara. It was Mr. Matsubara's recommendation that the Commission's conclusions reflect that the reclassification of the subject property consisting of approximately 7.42 acres situated at Kapaa, Kauai, from Agricultural to Urban, is reasonable, non-violative of Section 205-2 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, and is consistent with the Interim Statewide Land Use Guidance Policy established pursuant to Section 205-16.1 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended.

During the discussion that ensued, Mr. Matsubara responded to questions raised by the Commissioners regarding configuration of the lots, slopes, county's control over the development through issuance of various permits, etc.

Commissioner Carras moved to approve the subject application, which was seconded by Vice Chairman Nakagawa. The motion was carried with the following votes:

SP78-321 - EUNICE & JANE KAMANU
TO ALLOW THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FAMILY CARE HOME AT PU'UKAPU,
SOUTH KOHALA, HAWAII

Staff planner pointed out the location of the property under discussion on the maps and oriented its location with various surrounding landmarks. A resume of the staff memo was also presented.

It was moved by Commissioner Carras and seconded by Commissioner Oura to approve the Special Permit request, subject to the conditions set forth by the Hawaii County Planning Commission. The motion was unanimously carried.

SF78-322 - J. M. TANAKA CONSTRUCTION, INC.
TO ALLOW THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN OFFICE BUILDING AT KEAUHOU
1ST, NORTH KONA, HAWAII

A description of the subject property and pertinent facts contained within the staff memo were presented by Mr. Daniel Yasui, staff planner.

It was moved by Commissioner Oura, seconded by Commissioner Carras, and unanimously carried to approve the Special Permit, subject to the conditions imposed by the Hawaii County Planning Commission.

SP78-323 - SUNSET BEACH CHURCH OF CHRIST & CHRISTIAN TRAINING SCHOOL

TO ALLOW THE ADDITION OF A CLASSROOM BUILDING TO AN EXISTING PRIVATE SCHOOL COMPLEX AT PUPUKEA, OAHU, HAWAII

Mr. Yasui summarized the staff memo and pointed out the location of the subject parcel on the maps.

Discussion evolved around the question of the existing non-conforming buildings on the property and the proposed

addition being requested under the Special Permit, and the controls over any future expansion.

Commissioner Carras moved that condition No. 4 be amended to include the Land Use Commission, as well as the Planning Commission, in granting any time extension. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Oura and carried by voice vote.

Counselor Matsubara recommended that the County's condition No. 1 be extended to include: "Said uses shall not be expanded or increased in its intensity or changed to another non-conforming use without obtaining further Special Permit approval."

Vice Chairman Nakagawa moved that the Special Permit be approved, subject to the conditions imposed by the City Planning Commission, including amendments to conditions No. 1 and No. 4 as discussed by the Commission. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Machado and unanimously passed.

SP78-324 - AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL RENT-A-CAR
TO ALLOW THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CAR RENTAL OPERATION AT HOOLEHUA, MOLOKAI

Mr. Yasui presented a report of the subject request and identified the parcel involved on the maps.

Commissioner Machado moved to approve SP78-324, subject to the conditions imposed by the Maui County Planning Commission, which was seconded by Commissioner Carras and unanimously passed.

Closing arguments were waived by all parties to the proceedings.

Chairman Duke instructed all parties to file proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law, making appropriate reference to the page and line number of the transcript and/or exhibit numbers, when applicable. All parties were given 30 days following completion of the transcript to submit their proposed findings, and 15 days in which to comment on each other's findings.

At Mr. Fujimoto's request, Chairman Duke waived the requirement for DPED to submit proposed findings, etc.

Thereafter, the hearing on A78-441, Pacific Hawaiian, Ltd. was declared closed by the Chairman.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
