Aloha,

My name is Fay Sakata and I live on Mele Manu Street, near the site of the proposed charter school. The project will have an adverse impact on the surrounding neighborhood.

The record will show that there were considerable objections from the community. A petition was submitted which showed that of the 106 lots within the Pacific Plantation Subdivision, 90 or 85% opposed the project.

Further, a survey was taken of properties within 500 feet of the proposed site. There were 170 lots, excluding government land and road lots. Of these, 116 or 68% opposed; 54 or 31% took no position or could not be contacted (vacant land or absentee owners).

One of the criteria for a Special Permit is whether the use would have an "adverse impact to the surrounding property." The statement from the Police Department noting its adverse impact combined with the perceptions and statements of the overwhelming majority of the project's neighbors should be sufficient to conclude that the request indeed would have an adverse impact.

As noted by the Court, the Commission had a wide discretion in deciding whether to approve a special permit. While the request may meet some of the other criteria, the most critical one in our estimation - is its impact to the community. We therefore respectfully request the Commission to exercise its discretion and deny the request.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing in opposition of the proposed construction of the **Connections Public Charter School** campus in upper Kaumana, near Edita Street and Kaumana Drive. My home is located approximately 2 miles from this area and I have been a resident there for 42 years. As a result I believe that I am qualified to offer my opinion on this important matter.

First of all, the area is not equipped with the proper infrastructure to support a school campus of this size. There is no existing water supply source that could accommodate such a high consumption rate required for a school campus.

In addition to this, there is no existing wastewater system that could accommodate such a large facility. Flooding events are commonplace in this area and have presented numerous problems in the past. Most of the "run off" from rainstorms and flooding nearby is discharged via the Alenaio or Waipahoehoe streams and this project could exacerbate the problems related to this.

Finally, the construction of a large school campus on the proposed property would certainly create more traffic nearby and it would adversely affect safety and transportation issues for faculty, students, parents, fire-rescue services, law enforcement services *and* residents in the surrounding communities. This is not simply a matter of "not in my back yard," i.e. **NIMBY**, rather it is a matter of multiple complex essential issues that must be carefully considered for the *greater good* and the extenuating and far-reaching negative consequences which are likely to occur as a result of poor planning.

This email is to let you know that I oppose the building of Connections Public Charter School in Kaumana. My concern is that the school will increase traffic along Kaumana Drive, which would increase the potential for traffic accidents in an area that does not have the infrastructure to support it. Kaumana Dr. Is a narrow, winding road, and those who might speed or are not familiar with the roads could get into an accident.

The increased traffic will also result in difficulty for both residents of the area and patrons of the school trying to pull out of their driveway or streets in the mornings. The left turn from Edita onto Kaumana Drive is already dangerous as the bend in the road makes it difficult to see cars coming downhill until they are almost upon you. My name is Anna Kennedy, I own and live at 1300 Mele Manu Street in Pacific Plantation. Three generations live in this home. We are new to this address but not new to Hilo.

We are not opposed to the Connections Charter School concept but thoroughly question whether this is the right location for a school of this size and intended agricultural program. We fully support additional objections submitted by the neighborhood.

Our main concerns regarding the special permit as submitted by the Connections New Century Public Charter School would be Location for intended use, clientele; Safety of all concerned; More traffic on an already congested network; disruption of a primarily residential neighborhood. And just what is a special permit and how is it processed.

1. **Location:** Why would an agricultural School want to build on land designated by the Land Study Bureau "unsuitable for Agriculture." (1) The site is on top of the 1880-1881 pahoehoe lava flow and has very little soil. Wouldn't a piece of land in an established agriculture area make for a better learning environment? The school has declined such lands available for lease.

The property in question is in an already residential community and by admission the school will not serve the community. Majority of the students are from outside Hilo.

2. **Safety:** It is a documented that Pahoehoe flows typically have lava tubes with branches (2). Kamana Cave in fact lies under the upper portion of the Cave and has an opening on Edita Street. The question is how many tubes may lie under the remaining property. The existing cave and unknown tubes would be a safety issue especially for a public school. When "Johnny" falls through a tube or skips school and is injured in Kamana Cave right on Public School property the State will be open to

civil liability and litigation. There have already been injuries and death from cave ins on private property in the community.

- 3. **Traffic:** The studies on traffic counts for this project are 13 years old (as of May 2022) (4). Surely this is not sufficient information on the impact of additional traffic in 2022. Much building has been underway in the area. Property adjacent to the proposed school is up for sale and has been approved for a subdivision of six more lots. Kaumana Drive, a narrow winding mountain road, services a large area and is the main way in and out. The larger community already has a school at each end, both generating Hilo school traffic chaos. Edita street opening onto Kaumana drive is the only in and out for the whole Pacific Plantation and adjacent neighbors. Bottleneck in the making.
- 4. **Neighborhood Impact**: Adjacent neighbors will suffer. Our home and at least fifteen others in direct line of sight and sound will be subjected to at least 16-26 years of building according to the schools proposal to build in stages. As well as the general noise of a school and farm for years to come.

Edita street is used by the neighborhood for walking (It is the "flat" street) and of course additional traffic and likely new traffic patterns will endanger that activity. Not to mention local children on bicycles or the fact that it is the only way home for many homes on Edita and the whole of Pacific Plantation above.

5. **Special Permits for land Use**: From my research, I understand that special permits should benefit the surrounding area, should not require public agencies to expend extra services or heavily impact tax dollars for special or expanded services. And should fit the general plan for land use of an area. I strongly disagree with the decision to grant a special permit by the Hawaii County Windward Planning Commission in October 7,2021. No new evidence by all concerned parties was allowed at that

meeting ,although the Connections School did just that with no objections by the Commission. It was not clear to me that the Planning Commission fully exercised their responsibility as remanded by the Court of Appeals in January 2020. Much of the Intermediate Court of Appeals remand seemingly was totally disregarded and without explanation. It is our hope that the State Land Use Commission fully consider all aspects of the request for a special land use permit and from all concerned parties and angles.
