### DECLARATORY RULING REGARDING USE IN THE AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT

)

This proceeding was initiated by the Department of Planning and Economic Development on September 24, 1982, pursuant to Part VIII, Rules of Practice and Procedure of the State Land Use Commission to determine whether a private beach dwelling and accessory boat equipment storage structure qualify as permissible uses in the Agricultural District under Section 3-3 (6) of the State Land Use Commission's District Regulations. Subsection (6) of the section states that the following uses are permissible within the State Land Use Agricultural District:

> "(6) Public and private 'open area' types of recreational uses including day camps, picnic grounds, parks, and riding stables, but not including dragstrips, airports, drive-in theaters, golf courses, golf driving ranges, country clubs, and overnight camps."

The Land Use Commission on December 3, 1982, having considered the Petition for Declaratory Ruling filed by the Department of Planning and Economic Development, and written comments and oral arguments prescribed by representatives of the Department of Planning and Economic Development, and the City and County Department of General Planning, and Donald H. and Alma M. Chung, on December 3, 1982 has determined that a private beach dwelling and accessory boat equipment storage facility with no use related to agriculture are not permissible uses within the Agricultural District under Section 3-3 (6) of the Land Use Commission's District Regulations. Private beach dwellings are essentially residential dwellings. Although

recreation may be one aspect of the use for a dwelling, the principal use nevertheless remains residential. In addition, the uses do not qualify as an "open area" form of recreation such as that associated with parks, ball fields and picnic areas.
