

COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: 1 Aloha mai kakou. 2 Good morning. This is the September 17th, 2021, Land 3 Use Commission meeting, which is being held using interactive conference technology linking 4 5 videoconference participants and other interested 6 individuals of the public via the Zoom Internet 7 conferencing platform in order to comply with the 8 state and county official operational directives during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. 9

10 Members of the public are able to view the 11 meeting via the Zoom webinar platform.

12 Everybody, speak slowly and clearly and 13 identify yourselves for the record. We're taking the 14 transcripts from the record of this Zoom meeting, so 15 it really helps if you do that. In addition, keep in 16 mind we're recording this, so that if you're 17 participating, you're being recorded. If you don't 18 want to be recorded, you should leave the meeting 19 now.

In addition, keep in mind that since we're all accessing this meeting via our own personal digital devices, sometimes there's interruptions to connectivity. If this happens, please let us know and be patient as we try to restore connectivity during the pandemic.

Finally, we take breaks from time to time,
but we expect this meeting to last only until 10
a.m., when it will be adjourned.

10 My name is Jonathan Scheuer. I currently 11 have the pleasure and honor of serving as the Land 12 Use Commission Chair. With me, Commissioner Edmund 13 Aczon, Gary Okuda, our Executive Officer Daniel 14 Orodeneker, Chief Planner Scott Derrickson, Chief 15 Clerk Riley Hakoda, our Deputy Attorney General 16 Julie China, our Program Specialist Natasha Quinones are on the island of O'ahu. 17

18 Commissioner Nancy Cabral represents 19 Hawai'i island. Commissioner Lee Ohigashi represents 20 and is on Maui, and Commissioner Dan Giovanni 21 represents and is on the island of Kaua'i. We 22 currently have eight seated commissioners of a possible nine. Commissioners Wong and Chang are 23 excused from today's meeting. 24 25 Our first order of business will be



deferred, which is adoption of the September 8th 1 through 9th, 2021, meetings minutes. 2 3 Our next order of business is the tentative meeting schedule. Mr. Orodenker? 4 5 MR. ORODENKER: Thank you, Mr. Chair. 6 September 22nd's meeting has been 7 postponed to the --8 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Hold on. We cannot 9 hear you. 10 MR. ORODENKER: September 22nd's meeting 11 is currently taken off calendar. On September 23rd, 12 we will be meeting to take up the Waikapu properties 13 matter. On October 13th, we will be taking up Kihei High School and the Hokuao 201H Project. On October 14 14th, we have set aside an IAL desecration matter. 15 16 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Hold on. Sorry, Mr. 17 Orodenker, with the other noise in your room, that 18 last couple of sentences I could not catch. 19 MR. ORODENKER: Okay. On October 13th, we 20 will be taking up the Kihei High School matter and 21 the Hokuao 201H matter. On October 14th, we have the 22 O'ahu IAL matter. On October 27th, we have -- once 23 again have the Hokuao matter, and October 28th is 24 currently set aside for IAL matters. 25 On November 10th, we will be completing



1	the Hokuao 201H Project. We will not be holding a
2	meeting November 11th, as that is Veterans Day. On
3	November 24th, we will adopt the order on the Hokuao
4	matter, and November 25th is Thanksgiving.
5	On December 8th, we will take up the
6	airport hotel matter on Maui, as well as December
7	9th. December 22nd and 23rd are at the commission's
8	pleasure. And that's through the end of the year.
9	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you, Mr.
10	Orodenker. It would be helpful if a copy of that
11	could be emailed to the commissioners.
12	Commissioner Giovanni, you have a
13	question?
14	COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: I do.
15	So on October 13th, Mr. Orodenker, I don't
16	know if you saw my note, I'll be on the East Coast,
17	and I need to chair the session on the Kihei High
18	School, and it's pretty difficult for me. Is there
19	any opportunity to move that to the 15th? If not,
20	I'll have to work magic to be able to serve in that
21	chairmanship capacity on the 13th.
22	MR. ORODENKER: We can actually poll the
23	commissioners and see if that's a possibility. If
24	so, we will adjust the calendar and move the 13th
25	matters to the 15th.

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COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: 1 Thank you for that 2 consideration. I would appreciate it. 3 MR. ORODENKER: You're welcome. 4 COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: I'll be in New York on the 13th. I'm flying all day home on the 5 6 14th, and I'm free on the 15th. 7 MR. ORODENKER: We will do our best to 8 accommodate that, Vice Chair Giovanni. 9 COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: Thank you. 10 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you. Can I 11 ask that Mr. Derrickson, Ms. Quinones, or Mr. Hakoda to make me co-host so I can lower meeting hands and 12 13 otherwise control the meeting? 14 Any other questions for Mr. Orodenker 15 about our schedule, commissioners? 16 Seeing none, our next agenda item is the 17 adoption of the order for Docket No. SP21-412, a 18 special use permit application for the Mahi Solar 19 Project for an approximately 120-megawatt 20 alternating current solar and energy storage 21 facility located at Kunia, O'ahu. TMKs on the island 22 of O'ahu numbered as follows: 9-2001, a portion of 23 Lot 20, and 9-2004, a portion of Lot 3, a portion of 24 Lot 6, a portion of Lot 10, and a portion of Lot 12. 25 The commission last heard the matter on

September 9th via Zoom meeting. 1 Mr. Hakoda or Mr. Derrickson, have there 2 3 been any written testimony submitted on this matter? 4 MR. HAKODA: Yes. This is Riley. No 5 written testimony, but some informational material 6 that was requested was submitted by Ulupono -- I'm 7 sorry, I don't remember the name of the initiative. COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Ulupono Initiative? 8 9 MR. HAKODA: Ulupono Initiative. 10 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: And is that posted 11 or will be posted to the website? 12 MR. HAKODA: I circulated the email 13 earlier this morning, but I did not have time to post it to the website. 14 15 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay. Let's do 16 appearances with the -- starting with the 17 petitioner. 18 MR. SAKUMOTO: Good morning, Chair. Aloha, 19 commissioners. Randall Sakumoto on behalf of the 20 petitioner Mahi Solar LLC. I apologize. I thought 21 this meeting was at 10:00, so I apologize. I'm not 22 properly dressed, but I thought it would be better 23 to get on the meeting right now. 24 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you, Mr. 25 Sakumoto.

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1	City and County?
2	MR. PANG: Good morning, Mr. Chair,
3	members of the commission. Wayne Pang, deputy
4	corporation counsel on behalf of the Department of
5	Planning and Permitting.
6	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: OP?
7	MS. KATO: Alison Kato, deputy attorney
8	general for the Office of Planning and Sustainable
9	Development, and Lorraine Maki from the Office of
10	Planning. Thank you.
11	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay. Thank you
12	very much.
13	And you might be relieved, Mr. Sakumoto,
14	that you are better dressed than some people were at
15	the start of this meeting, so which was the
16	subject of discussion before we opened things up
17	formally.
18	With that, is there any members of the
19	public who wish to testify on the adoption of the
20	order? If so, please raise your hand using the
21	software function or the *9 function for the
22	individual who is calling in to this meeting. Does
23	anybody wish to testify?
24	Okay. There is a raised hand from phone
25	number 808-222-2826. I'm going to admit this
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individual into the meeting. Actually, the way it 1 2 works for a call-in, I'm going to allow them to 3 talk. So aloha and good morning. You've raised 4 5 your hand, wishing to testify on the adoption of the 6 order on this matter; is that correct? 7 MR. DELAUNAY: Yes. 8 **COMMISSIONER SCHEUER:** Okay. Would you 9 please state your name and address for the record? 10 MR. DELAUNAY: Okay. It's Christopher 11 Delaunay with Pacific Resource Partnership, and 12 we're at 1100 Alakea Street, Honolulu, Hawai'i 13 96813. COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: 14 Okay, Mr. Delaunay. 15 Thank you very much. Nice to hear you again. Do you 16 swear or affirm the testimony you're about to give 17 is the truth? 18 MR. DELAUNAY: I do. 19 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay. If you could 20 do this in a couple of minutes, that would be great. 21 Please proceed. 22 MR. DELAUNAY: Sure. Yes. We did submit 23 written testimony earlier in the hearing process, 24 but Pacific Resource Partnership is in strong 25 support of the Mahi Solar Project, and we



respectfully request the commission's favorable
 decision on the project's Special Permit
 application.

The Mahi Solar Project would provide a valuable opportunity to stimulate our economy both by creating new jobs and by creating infrastructure which can help lower energy costs for consumers and businesses. Construction of the project will support approximately 340 jobs during the peak of construction.

And also, when completed, this nearly triple solar project will be capable of generating enough energy to power approximately 37,000 homes on O'ahu, which will advance the state closer toward achieving its goal to generate 100 percent clean energy by 2045.

17 So we hope that you can -- you will have a 18 favorable decision on this project. And thanks for 19 this opportunity to testify.

20 **COMMISSIONER SCHEUER:** Thank you very 21 much, Mr. Delaunay. Please stay available in case 22 there are any questions from the parties.

23	Commissioner Cabral, are you prepared to				
24	participate? The oral would be great.				
25	COMMISSIONER CABRAL: Yes. I am prepared.				



Thank you. 1 2 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you very 3 much. Commissioner Okuda? 4 5 COMMISSIONER OKUDA: Yes. I am. 6 **COMMISSIONER SCHEUER:** Commissioner 7 Ohigashi? COMMISSIONER OHIGASHI: 8 Yes. 9 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Commissioner 10 Giovanni? 11 COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: Yes. 12 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Commissioner Aczon? 13 COMMISSIONER ACZON: Yes, Mr. Chair. 14 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Did I miss any? I'm 15 also prepared as the chair to participate. We will 16 now consider adoption of the order. 17 Commissioner, before you for your consideration, deliberation, and adoption are 18 19 proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and 20 Decision and Order prepared by the staff as 21 instructed at the last meeting on the docket. Is 22 there any discussion? 23 I will entertain a motion to approve the 24 form of the order for Docket No. SP21-412 Findings 25 of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Decision and Order

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1	for Mahi Solar O'ahu Special Use Permit application				
2	for the Mahi Solar Project.				
3	Commissioners, what is your pleasure?				
4	Commissioner Giovanni?				
5	COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: I move that we				
6	adopt the order as presented.				
7	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Is there a second?				
8	Commissioner Cabral, do you second it?				
9	COMMISSIONER CABRAL: I would be honored				
10	to second that motion.				
11	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay. Thank you.				
12	Commissioners, we are in discussion. There				
13	is a motion on the table made by Commissioner				
14	Giovanni and seconded by Commissioner Cabral.				
15	Commissioner Gary Okuda?				
16	COMMISSIONER OKUDA: Thank you, Mr. Chair.				
17	I think one issue we need to resolve, which is not a				
18	major issue, is should the order contain those				
19	statutes referenced at the very end of the revised				
20	order in detail, or should there just be a simple				
21	paragraph which summarizes the fact that in the				
22	conclusions of law, the solar project satisfies the				
23	the intent and the statutes as passed by the				
24	legislature?				
25	I had initially suggested that the order				

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1	contain verbatim quotations from the statute to
2	show, you know, these the very detailed
3	legislative intent, but I don't have any strong
4	feelings if, you know, the long verbiage is left out
5	and a simple paragraph is adopted instead.
6	Conclusions of law, as we know, on appeal
7	are reviewed de novo, so the appellate court will
8	look at it without giving us any deference. The
9	findings of fact, on the other hand, if we make a
10	determination that we believe in the credibility of
11	a witness or make findings regarding factual
12	matters, there's deference given to us.
13	But as far as the conclusions of law,
14	whether it's the you know, my initially suggested
15	long form or a short summary, I I don't have any
16	strong feelings one way or the other. I I don't
17	know what everyone else thinks.
18	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Perhaps well, so
19	I might need a little guidance from our executive
20	officer on how to handle this discussion of adoption
21	of the order.
22	Mr. Orodenker?
23	MR. ORODENKER: I think that if if I
24	guess the proper thing to do here is under Robert's
25	Rules and, Ms. China, you can stop me if I'm

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1	wrong is for Commissioner Okuda to make a				
2	proposed amendment to the motion that's on the floor				
3	for discussion purposes, and if that proposed				
4	amendment fails, then we move with the original.				
5	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay.				
6	MR. ORODENKER: If the proposed amendment				
7	succeeds, then you will put that in the motion.				
8	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you.				
9	Ms. China?				
10	MS. CHINA: That is correct. You should				
11	somebody should propose to amend what's on the				
12	floor, and you can go from there.				
13	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you, Ms.				
14	China.				
15	And this confirms what my belief was, was				
16	the proper method of considering this, but I wanted				
17	to confirm.				
18	Commissioner Ohigashi?				
19	COMMISSIONER OHIGASHI: I'm amenable to				
20	having a short version that was placed in it,				
21	because in my mind, the statute speaks for itself,				
22	and reference to it would be sufficient.				
23	If Mr. Okuda can consider just amending or				
24	withdrawing amending it for the short version, I				
25	think that I would be able to support it. And we can				

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go from there, since he seems to indicate that the -1 2 - it is the either/or. 3 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you, 4 Commissioner Ohigashi. 5 So right now, we had a comment offered by 6 Commissioner Okuda. There's no friendly amendment 7 yet to amend the motion. 8 So, Commissioner Okuda? 9 COMMISSIONER OKUDA: Thank you, Mr. Chair. 10 I offer a friendly amendment that the form of the 11 order that is adopted is the form that has the 12 summary, a short -- what we would call the short 13 paragraph, and not the long quotations which had been proposed, new paragraphs 19 through 24. So that 14 15 would not be -- the long version would not be the 16 form of the order that was adopted. 17 I would offer a friendly amendment or a 18 request that the motion be amended to include the 19 just short version, and I -- I understand and agree 20 with Commissioner Ohigashi's analysis. 21 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: To be really 22 explicit on the record of our proceedings, Commissioner Okuda, is there a paragraph to be added 23 24 that you could read into the record that you are 25 proposing as a friendly amendment to the final

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order? 1 2 COMMISSIONER OKUDA: Yes, Mr. Chair. I 3 propose that the order that is adopted contain 4 paragraph 19, which reads as follows. And I will 5 quote it. 6 "19. The project is consistent with the 7 legislature's statement of energy policy as set forth in HRS Section 196-1, HRS Section 226-18, and 8 9 the State of Hawai'i's stated policy to mitigate its 10 greenhouse gas emissions by sequestering more 11 atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases than the 12 state produces as quickly as practicable, but no 13 later than 2045, pursuant to HRS Chapter 225P, HRS Section 225P-1." 14 15 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay. Is the movant 16 and the seconder amenable to the inclusion of this 17 language in the adoption of the order? 18 Commissioner Giovanni? 19 **COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI:** The movant -- the movant welcomes this amendment to the motion. 20 21 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Commissioner 22 Cabral? 23 COMMISSIONER CABRAL: And the seconder 24 welcomes this motion -- this amendment to the 25 wonderful motion. Thank you.

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1	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Okay. So I realize
2	we are in deliberation now. I would have normally
3	only called on any of the parties if there was a
4	specific question, but I want to take the privilege
5	to do so just in case the applicant is has any
6	statement or concern or seeking of clarity as to
7	what we were just doing on this amendment.
8	Mr. Sakumoto, does your client have any
9	concern with adding this additional language that
10	simply states that this project is indeed consistent
11	with state policy?
12	MR. SAKUMOTO: No concerns, Chair.
13	COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you.
14	With that, we have a motion before us,
15	folks. Who would like to speak to the adoption of
16	the order as moved and amended? Anyone?
17	Commissioner Giovanni?
18	COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: Yeah. I made this
19	motion originally to approve this project as as
20	approved with a few conditions that were brought
21	forth by by OP. And I continue to be in strong
22	support of this project, and I welcome this
23	amendment from Commissioner Okuda.
24	Although there is not has not been a
25	full-blown analysis of the impact on the carbon

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NAEGELI (800)528-3335 DEPOSITION & TRIAL 1 footprint that this project would have on the carbon 2 footprint of Hawai'i, it's clear in my personal 3 opinion that this one project will have the most 4 impact on that matter of any project I'm familiar 5 with.

6 So it's very much aligned with the intent 7 of energy and climate change policy in the state, 8 and for those reasons, I encourage adoption of the 9 order.

10 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Further comments.
 11 Commissioner Cabral?

12 COMMISSIONER CABRAL: I will second that 13 opinion, and I am personally thrilled to be on this 14 commission and to be able to make this step forward to what is, in my favorite words, common sense, that 15 we have all of this sun and that we're able to 16 17 convert that and help save so much fossil fuels from 18 entering our environment and from having to pay for 19 those fossil fuels.

And so I know that there's costs involved with everything, but I'm just thrilled that we're able to be a part of moving our state forward and have approximately 37,000 homes have electricity in such a project. And I welcome having more of these wonderful type of considerations in the future.

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Thank you. 1 2 **COMMISSIONER SCHEUER:** Other comments? 3 Seeing none, Mr. Orodenker, would you 4 please poll the commission? 5 MR. ORODENKER: Mr. Chair, the motion is 6 to adopt the order with a friendly amendment of the 7 order to be adopted with a short paragraph regarding 8 consistency with the state energy policy. 9 Commissioner Giovanni? 10 COMMISSIONER GIOVANNI: Aye. 11 MR. ORODENKER: Commissioner Cabral? 12 COMMISSIONER CABRAL: Aye. 13 MR. ORODENKER: Commissioner Okuda? COMMISSIONER OKUDA: Yes. 14 15 MR. ORODENKER: Commissioner Ohigashi? 16 COMMISSIONER OHIGASHI: Yes. 17 MR. ORODENKER: Commissioner Aczon? 18 COMMISSIONER ACZON: Yes. 19 MR. ORODENKER: Commissioner Chang and 20 Commissioner Wong are absent. 21 Commissioner Chair Scheuer? 22 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Aye. 23 MR. ORODENKER: Thank you, Mr. Chair. The 24 motion passes with six affirmative votes. 25 COMMISSIONER SCHEUER: Thank you.
