Dear LUC commissioners,  
I wanted to reach out to you and the Council team re: our predicament on the huge proposed 752 so-called affordable single family homes that the out of state developer is still trying to push for, along the Agricultural Watershed Mountains along Kahekili HWY, that provide water to many other parts of Maui, including Kihei and Wailea. I don't think that the Southside Maui is aware of where their water comes from. And certainly this developer isn't aware or just doesn't care about MAUI'S water resources.

Our [pwamaui.org](http://pwamaui.org) is very concerned over this matter because of all those people suffering from a water crisis in West Maui. I can't even imagine the Resorts and visitors on the west side are having loss of water pressure. And I'm sure they are able to flush toilets and take showers anytime they want. When are people and the County Officials and the LUC going to wake up and help out with this: out of state developer's re:zoning efforts and intentions. Kahekili HWY can't handle the over population, or the water crisis struggle. Why build giant (almost 1000) more densely placed homes, concrete & pave it all in, and then direct all the refuse water used toward Kahului water reclamation plant and then

lost to the Ocean. The existing Watershed Wells in this side of the mountains will not be replenished from then on. This water never returns you know, to the Watershed. And this Watershed is dangerously low and becoming more and more saline, brackish, and we're still in a drought. This is just not the time to consider urbanizing Kahekili HWY Agricultural Land.

I wish you could consider this side of Maui, with your consideration, you won't add to the West Maui Water Crisis We need to get the word out about the need to protect our Maui water sources and resources. We need funding to show these (out of state) OVER-DEVELOPING companies that they can't just come here promising fast Track affordable single family homes, "Especially" when these same urbanized homes will be threatened with water shortage crisis of their own, (While they're sitting on a dwindling Agricultural Watershed?) So more reason not to over populate certain areas when the Island cannot support amenities like WATER. In fact it will waste what resources of water and Agricultural Lands we still have in Maui.
