I am heartbroken and angry about still being on Lokelani Intermediate School's campus because we are not allowed to use our ready campus buildings. The reason I'm upset and angry is that months and months go by, and we're still not on our own campus. I'm not getting the high school experience everyone else is getting because we can't go to high school yet. If we were on campus, we wouldn't have to wait until 1pm to eat lunch. We have been waiting and waiting, but each time it gets pushed back, it isn't very pleasant because I got my hopes up and then it hasn't happened.

The principal has put time and money into getting us a way for it to be safe to get to school; we students have agreed to either get dropped off and picked up by parents or the shuttle that the principal has provided us. All we were asking is that you give us a chance to be able to experience being a high school student because we're the ones living it, while you're the ones supervising it.

Please consider those most affected by your decision and amend the 2013 Condition to allow us to safely use our campus while the adults keep talking about the grade-separated pedestrian crossing.
