

Aloha Chair Giovanni and Members of the Commission,

I am Scott Ferguson, a parent of a freshman at Kūlanihāko'i High School in Kihei. I appreciate you taking the time to reconsider the issue of the improvement condition imposed by your Commission in 2013.

I made the decision to send my child to Kūlanihāko'i High School because it's important for me to support our community and I want my child to be part of creating this important legacy. Having this high school means that children from South Maui will be able to attend a neighborhood high school instead of us having to transport her all the way to Kahului, as working parents my wife and I would be unable to do so. This school also represents something that will bring our community together in a very special way. While I appreciate Lokelani Intermediate School hosting the students, it is time for KHS to move to the brand new campus buildings now that they are completed. As a parent and a taxpayer, I want our money to be used effectively. To me, that means using these completed buildings in the way they are intended.

Much of the public seems unaware that our school is already operating, that our students understand the importance of safety, and that my child has pledged not to cross the highway on foot, but to use the transportation provided by the school and me. You have received plenty of testimony from adults who believe they know what our students will do and how, but I implore you to listen to the students themselves and the adults who work closely with them.

Please note our child will be utilizing the KHS "shuttle buses" to bring our child to and from campus, so he will not be crossing the Highway to get to school.

Please consider those most affected by your decision and amend the 2013 Condition to allow us to safely use our campus while the grade-separated crossing is being completed.
