1. Quarry Relocation from Existing Puu Palailai Site to New Puu Makakilo Site

The following are our comments and recommendations on the subject statements:

1. Quarry and Plant Operations - Our concern here is the potential nuisance to the nearby Makakilo Elementary School from the dust. The quantity of dust even within the legal limits may be intolerable and disruptive to the school operations. We feel that the company should give some assurance to the school that corrective measures will be taken.

We are recommending that the company make the following commitment:

- a. As necessary, the company shall agree to take reasonable action beyond meeting legal limits imposed by the State Department of Health's Air Pollution Control Regulations.


b. The Department of Health shall have the final say as to what constitutes reasonable action.
